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

Outreach Work

1) Rough sleeping

People seen by outreach or building based (BBS) teams in the year - rough sleeping or contacted either on the streets or in services

166 verified rough sleepers were contacted by services in Hammersmith & Fulham during the year. This is an increase from 161 last year.

Of these 166, 81 had a bedded down street contact in the quarter and so were known to have slept rough in Hammersmith & Fulham during the year. The number sleeping rough this year has decreased by 16%.

2) Rough sleeping (rolling) (flow, stock and returner)

People seen rough sleeping by outreach or building based (BBS) teams in the year by the flow, stock and returner model


The flow, stock and returner model categorises people seen sleeping rough according to whether they have also been seen bedded down in previous periods:

Flow People who have never been seen sleeping rough before

Stock People who have also been seen bedded down between 1st April 2010 to 31 March 2011.

Returner People who were also seen sleeping rough at least over a year ago, but not between 1st April 2009 and 31st


43 people rough sleeping were flow (new to the streets). This means they had not previously been contacted by any outreach or BBS team that reports to CHAIN and were verified as a rough sleeper this year.

23 people rough sleeping were stock. This means they had been contacted by an outreach or BBS team during this year in addition to the year preceding this period.

15 people seen rough sleeping were returners. This means they had been seen sleeping rough by outreach or BBS teams sometime before 1st April 2009, have not sleep rough for at least a year, but have been seen sleeping rough this year.

3) Rough sleeping volume (flow, stock and returner)

The proportion of people who are flow has fluctuated in recent years: 2007-08, 63%; 2008-09, 41%; 2009-10, 78%; 2010-11, 53%.


Of the 81 people seen rough sleeping this quarter, 31 only had a single bedded down street contact.

Of the 81 people seen bedded down, 4 were from CEE countries and seen only once during the period.

NB CEE nationals often cannot be offered the same service as other people due to benefit restrictions.


4) People Contacted by Month

61 (37%) verified rough sleepers contacted across Hammersmith & Fulham this year have never had a booking in action recorded on CHAIN. This is consistent with the previous two years.

42 of these people have slept rough in the year, which is 52% of all people sleeping rough this year.

15 (25%) of the people who have never had a booking in action recorded on CHAIN have only ever had one street contact recorded.

^{*}Since the way in which accommodation and reconnection work has changed since the introduction of the new CHAIN system not all categories are comparable. Those which are, have been completed for the previous year.

Outreach and BBS teams across Hammersmith & Fulham succeeded in reconnecting or booking into accommodation 26 people, 16% of the 166 people contacted during the year.

This is a slightly lower proportion than previous periods - 2009/10: 37%, 2008/09: 25%.

25 people had a total of 27 booking in events. This indicates that individuals can be booked into accommodation (the same type or different) more than once in the year.

 ${\bf 1}$ person was booked into long-term accommodation.

This figure refers to people booked into long-term accommodation by outreach teams only. For figures relating to people leaving hostels to move onto mid to long-term accommodation, please refer to section 11.

26 people were booked into hostel accommodation.


Outreach and BBS teams across Hammersmith & Fulham achieved a confirmed reconnection with 1 person they contacted this year. This is 1% of the people contacted by outreach or BBS teams this year.

1 confirmed reconnection event was recorded by outreach and BBS teams for verified rough sleepers this year.

7) Arrivals

29 people arrived at accommodation in Hammersmith & Fulham this year. These 29 people had 37 arrival actions. This indicates that an individual can arrive more than once (at the same accommodation project or different) in a period.

The number of arrivals has been falling in recent years: 2007-08, 53; 2008-09, 49; 2009-10, 44.


The number of arrivals referred by another accommodation project is consistent with last year, but has risen compared to earlier years: 2007-08,8%; 2008-09, 4%; 2009-10, 18%; 2010-11, 22%. It is higher than the proportion across all boroughs this year, 10%.

40 people departed from accommodation in Hammersmith & Fulham this year. These 40 people had 44 departure actions. This indicates that an individual can depart more than once (at the same accommodation project or different) in a period.

23% of people left accommodation to move to another hostel. This is consistent with previous years, and with the proportion across all boroughs this year.


42% of people left accommodation to move to mid to long-term accommodation. This is higher than the previous two years: 2008-09, 29%; 2009-10. 22%.

40 people departed from accommodation in Hammersmith & Fulham this year. These 40 people had 44 departure actions. This indicates that an individual can depart more than once (from the same accommodation project or different) in a period.

This is slightly lower than the previous two years, when it was 48 and 49.

59% of departures were due to a planned move. This is consistent with the previous two years, and with the proportion across all boroughs this year.

7% of departures were due to abandonments. This is consistent with the previous two years, and with the proportion across all boroughs this year.

7% of departures were due to evictions. This is consistent with the previous two years, and with the proportion across all boroughs this year.



People contacted by outreach or BBS teams and/or arriving in or departing from accommodation in the year by gender




52% of people contacted in Hammersmith & Fulham this year were aged 26-45. This is consistent with the previous three years.


The majority of people contacted in Hammersmith & Fulham in 2010-11 are white (77%), half of which are White - Other.

15% of people contacted are black and 2% are Asian. The ethnic origin of those contacted in Hammersmith & Fulham is consistent with last year.

Of the 69 people contacted in 2008/09 with an ethnic origin of White - Other, 63 are CEE nationals (see section 15 for a more detailed breakdown).





It is possible for someone contacted to have previous experience of more than one institution and so be included in more than one of the above figures. 8 people contacted in the year have been in care and prison.


The proportion of people contacted in Hammersmith & Fulham with previous experience of the armed forces, care or prison is consistent with the three previous years.

Of the 166 verified rough sleepers contacted this year, 78 (47%) have been assessed as engaging in one or more street activities.

Some of these people contacted this year have been seen engaging in more than one type of street activity at some point.

In addition to the 166 verified rough sleepers contacted in the year by outreach or BBS teams, 17 people who have not been seen rough sleeping were also contacted. Of these:

None had confirmed reconnections;

 $\boldsymbol{7}$ were recorded as having arrived at accommodation reporting to CHAIN.
