

# **Outreach Work**

# 1) Rough sleeping

People seen by outreach or building based (BBS) teams in the quarter - rough sleeping or contacted either on the streets or in services



163 verified rough sleepers were contacted by services in Lambeth during the quarter. This is a slight increase from 158 last quarter and compares to 197 in the same quarter last year.

Of these 163, 86 had a bedded down street contact in the quarter and so were known to have slept rough in Lambeth during the quarter. The number sleeping rough this quarter has increased by 4%.

# 2) Rough sleeping volume

People seen rough sleeping by number of bedded down contacts during the quarter

38 people were seen rough sleeping for the first time this quarter (flow).

Of the 86 people seen rough sleeping this quarter, 57 only had a single bedded down street contact.

Of the 86 people seen bedded down, 7 were from CEE countries and seen only once during the period.

NB CEE nationals often cannot be offered the same service as other people due to benefit restrictions.



# 4) People contacted by month


People seen rough sleeping by outreach or building based (BBS) teams by month

26 (16%) verified rough sleepers contacted across Lambeth this quarter have never had a booking in action recorded on CHAIN. This has decreased slightly from 30 (19%) in the previous period.

19 of these people have slept rough in the quarter, which is 22% of all people sleeping rough this quarter.

5 (19%) of the people who have never had a booking in action recorded on CHAIN have only ever had one street contact recorded.

1 person in Lambeth has never had a booking in action despite having over a hundred street contacts. This is consistent with previous quarters.

Outreach and BBS teams across Lambeth succeeded in reconnecting or booking into accommodation 42 people, 26% of the 163 people contacted during the quarter.

This is a lower proportion than previous periods (Jan - Mar, 38%; Oct - Dec, 43%; Jul -Sep, 26%).

38 people had a total of 47 booking in events. This indicates that individuals can be booked into accommodation (the same type or different) more than once in the quarter.

1 person moved into supported private rented sector accommodation and 2 people into supported housing.

14 people were booked into hostel accommodation. This is lower than previous periods (Jan-Mar 36, Oct-Dec 48, Jul-Sep 30).

Outreach and BBS teams across Lambeth achieved a confirmed reconnection with 4 people they contacted this quarter. This is 2% of the people contacted by outreach or BBS teams this quarter.


4 confirmed reconnection events were recorded by outreach and BBS teams for verified rough sleepers this quarter. In addition, teams recorded 1 such actions for the wider street population (people not seen sleeping rough).

In addition, 25 people were referred to the No Second Night Out Assessment Hub. Of these, 17 achieved either a confirmed reconnection or an accommodation stay, or both.

# 7) Arrivals

15 people arrived at accommodation in Lambeth this year. These 15 people had 15 arrival actions.

The numbers of people arriving and arrivals are lower than previous periods (Jul-Sep: 56, Oct-Dec: 63, Jan-Mar: 47).


The proportion of arrivals to accommodation in Lambeth that were referred by outreach or BBS teams and other acccommodation projects is lower than previous periods this quarter.


- 41 people departed from accommodation in Lambeth this year. These 41 people had 41 departure actions.
- 22% of people left accommodation to move to another hostel. This is a slight decrease on the previous two periods.
- 41% of people left accommodation to move to mid to long-term accommodation. This is an increase on the previous three periods.

# 9) Departures - reason for leaving

41 people departed from accommodation in Lambeth this year. These 41 people had 41 departure actions.

As with arrivals, the number of people departing and departures is lower than previous quarters.

73% of departures were due to a planned move. This is similar to previous quarters.

5% of departures were due to abandonments. This is consistent with the previous quarter.





The proportion of people contacted in Lambeth with an alcohol support need is consistent with the previous two periods.

The proportion of people contacted in Lambeth with an alcohol support need (63%) is slightly higher than the proportion across all boroughs (54%) this quarter.

22 people contacted in Lambeth this quarter have previously been in care (22 last quarter).


62 people contacted in Lambeth this quarter have previously been in prison (54 last quarter).

It is possible for someone contacted to have previous experience of more than one institution and so be included in more than one of the above figures. 16 people contacted in the year have been in care and prison.

The proportion of people contacted in Lambeth with previous experience of the armed forces, care or prison is consistent with previous periods in the quarter.

### 12) Street activity

Street population (people who rough sleep and/or engage in a street lifestyle) contacted by outreach who fall into one or more of the street activity categories on CHAIN

Of the 163 verified rough sleepers contacted this quarter, 52 (32%) have been assessed as engaging in one or more street activities.

Some of these people contacted this quarter have been seen engaging in more than one type of street activity at some point.

In addition to the 163 verified rough sleepers contacted in the quarter by outreach or BBS teams, 6 people who are considered vulnerable but have not been seen rough sleeping were also contacted. Of these:

- 1 had a confirmed reconnection;
- 1 was booked into accommodation in Lambeth
- $\boldsymbol{1}$  was recorded as having arrived at accommodation reporting to CHAIN.
