This CHAIN report for October to December 2010 reports on verified rough sleepers contacted by the Croydon Reach, Ealing SPOT, Wandsworth Equinox Outreach, London Street Rescue, CHC Brent Outreach, Richmond Outreach, Pilion ECO and Heathrow Airport outreach teams in the outer London boroughs.

Most of the tables in this report are split by borough. Since clients do move between boroughs and can be contacted more than once in any given period; they may as a consequence feature in more than one set of borough figures. The total number of unique clients seen rough sleeping in this period was 292, compared to 256 the previous quarter. The total overall - people contacted, or arriving or departing from accommodation - was 565, compared to 532 last quarter and 415 Apr-Jun 2010.

Of the 26 outer London boroughs 12 have seen an increase in the number of clients seen rough sleeping, 11 have seen a decrease. Overall there were 36 more people seen in this period than April to June 2010.

Overall the highest number of people seen rough sleeping was in Heathrow - 36 (22 people seen rough sleeping for the first time). Brent saw the largest increase in rough sleepers - from 7 last quarter to 24 in October to December. The largest decrease was in Lewisham - from 39 last quarter to 16 this quarter.

Just over 2 in 5 people contacted in the outer London boroughs in October to December 2010 were White British followed by 86 (15%) White Other and 66 (12%) people of Black ethnic origin. 15 (23%) of the 66 people of Black ethnic origin were contacted in Islington. Twenty-six (2 in 5) people contacted in Ealing were Asian.
